

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ABOUT UGANDA

Uganda "the pearl of Africa", a landlocked country in East Africa, is located on Lake Victoria and has around 40 million inhabitants. Uganda became independent from the United Kingdom in 1962. The capital is Kampala. In addition to the official language English, Swahili and 40 other languages are spoken in the country. The mostly English-speaking population consists of a large number of tribes known for their friendliness. Beyond the Big Five, the primates, especially the mountain gorillas and the chimpanzees, represent a special attraction of the country. Uganda is characterized by lakes, the Nile, primeval forests and savannahs. The equator runs in the south of the country. Uganda's lowest point is the lower reaches of the Albert Nile at around 610 m above sea level. Margherita Peak (also: Mount Stanley) in the Ruwenzori Mountains as the highest point is 5109 m high. The total area of the country is 241,038 square kilometers, of which 199,710 square kilometers are land and 36,330 square kilometers are water areas. Nine national parks and six game reserves testify to the natural beauty of the country and the will to protect it. They are spread across the country and are usually near the borders and less in the center of the country. This protects different landscapes and ways of life.

The Queen Elizabeth National Park is characterized by the beautiful Edward Lake in the west and Lake George in the east. Both lakes are connected by the Kazinga Canal. Hippos and pelicans are eye-catching, and the presence of African buffalos, elephants, lions, various antelopes and over 600 species of birds indicate the ecological diversity of the area.



The Rwenzori National Park has preserved part of its inaccessibility and mysterious fascination. The 120 km long mountain range with glaciers, rivers, bogs, lakes and moss-covered forests is one of the most impressive in the world. In the heart, is the third highest mountain in Africa – Margherita Peak (5109m), in whose glaciers, the source of the Nile originates. The Rwenzori is considered the most densely vegetated area on earth.

The largest protected area in the country extends over Murchison Falls National Park. A spectacular waterfall of the Victoria Nile, where Nile Crocodiles and Hippos live, gave the park its name. A special feature of this animal-rich savanna landscape are the rare Uganda giraffe (also: Rothschild giraffe) and the rare shoebill stork.

Kibale National Park is known for its habitat chimpanzees. Its rainforests house a total of 13 types of primates (including the red colobus and the Eastern Bearded Monkey) and, a larger population of Forest Elephants. The park covers 766 km² and is about 40 km South of Fort Portal.

The Bwindi Impenetrable National Park has been a World Heritage Site since 1994 and protects the habitat of 400 Mountain Gorillas. That is 50% of the world's total population. The national park is between 1160 m and 2600 m high. On so-called Gorilla tracking, visitors have the opportunity to visit these threatened, habituated Mountain Gorillas. Thanks to strictly limited Gorilla permits, the protection of the Gorillas is guaranteed and the remaining habitat of the Gorilla groups is supported.

The Semiliki National Park in Western Uganda is known for its geyser-like sources. It offers an enormously large abundance of species, as two large landscapes overlap with their animal world.

To the South, is Lake Mburo National Park, whose habitat consists of open grasslands, acacia forests, swamps and several lakes. A special highlight are the guided walking safaris.

The hard-to-reach Kidepo Valley National Park in the far Northeast of Uganda is the jewel for wildlife viewing. Its landscape is shaped by the two valley systems; Narus and Kidepo Valleys.





NATIONAL PARKS

Uganda is endowed with wildlife and a variety of eye-catching sites. Most of these are found in various parks around the country.



Queen Elizabeth National Park (QENP):

This is the most popular and visited national park in Uganda. The park stands out for its diverse landscape and wildlife. Queen Elizabeth receives good rains compared to the Masai Maara and Serengeti hence giving visitors more panoramic views for much of the year. Among the amazing features in the park include crater lakes, Gorges, Salt Lakes and rift valley Lakes like George and Edward. Queen Elizabeth national park is famous for hosting the rare tree climbing lions but visitors can also spot chimpanzees at the Maramagambo and the amazing Kyambura Gorge. The Kazinga channel In Queen Elizabeth National Park is one of the best places to spot birds in the world. During certain months of the year the sheer density of birds within and around the channel will leave even the most seasoned birders very impressed. Other activist and attractions include nature walks at the Maramagambo forest, hot air balloon wildlife viewing, visiting the Katwe salt mining lake, cultural visits and taking part in wildlife research tours



Bwindi Impenetrable Forest:

Bwindi is found in the South Western part of the country next to the Democratic Republic of Congo. Bwindi Impenetrable National Park is UNESCO World heritage site because of the mountain gorillas and overall biodiversity. Gorilla trekking and the gorilla habituation experience are the most popular activities in Bwindi but visitors can also take part in nature walks, community visits and bird watching. Bwindi along with the Virunga National Park in Congo are the only places where chimpanzees and Mountain Gorillas can be sighted together. Read more about Bwindi Impenetrable National Park.



Murchison Falls National Park:

Murchison Falls National Park is one of the best places to go on a wildlife safari in Africa. It is the largest park in Uganda and found on the North-western part of the country. Murchison falls like Queen Elizabeth National Park is blessed with diverse features and landscape offering a whole lot of things to do. The key attraction is the beautiful Murchison Falls on the great river Nile. The park also attracts visitors because it is the only place where one can spot all the big five mammals. Although Rhinos are extinct in the park, they can be seen at the adjacent Ziwa Rhino sanctuary on the way to and from the park. Murchison Falls is a lion conservation unit and has more Roskilde Giraffe than any other park in Uganda. Apart from game drives and visiting the top of the falls, visitors can choose to track Chimpanzee in Budongo Forest or go for a boat cruise below the falls to spot one of the largest collection of crocodiles, hippos and birds. Apart from the game drives and boat cruises, visitor also have an opportunity to view wildlife from a hot air balloon or visit the local Boomu Women's group to mingle with locals. Read more about Murchison Falls National Park.

Kibale National Park:

Kibale Forest is known as the primate capital of Uganda. There are more primates here than anywhere else in Uganda – over 13 species including chimpanzees. Kibale Forest is arguably the best place for tracking chimpanzees in the world (over 5000 individuals). The key difference between chimpanzee tracking in Kibale and other national park lies in the success rate of finding the primates. Unlike gorillas, chimps are very mobile and locating a family can be difficult since they don't stay in one place for too long. The chances of finding the primates in Kibale are very high. Unfortunately there are no gorillas in the park. Had it been the case, the number of visitors to the park would be phenomenal. Apart from primates, Kibale forest is a birders paradise with over 370 species. Visitors also have opportunities to take part in nature walks and community visits.

Kidepo Valley National Park:

Kidepo is one of Uganda's true hidden gems. Located far away at the North-Eastern corner of the country, the park has vegetation, seasons and landscape that are similar to that found in Masai Maraa but with virgin wilderness and less crowds. Kidepo Valley National is the only park in Uganda where ostriches, cheetahs and wild dogs still thrive. The scenery and landscape in Kidepo is so stunning that CNN described it as one of the best national parks in Africa. Sadly, this amazing park is less visited by tourists in part because of its remote location and a past history of being a hideout for rebels. Game drives are the main activity in the park. A game drive in Kidepo Valley National Park provides opportunities to spot lions, leopards, buffaloes and Elephants, ostriches among others. A cultural visit can also be arranged to visit the Karamojong, Dodoth or the endangered lk tribe. Other activities in the park include mountain climbing nature walks and visiting hot springs.



Rwenzori Mountains National Park:

This is another UNESCO World Heritage in the south-western corner of the country and next to the Virunga National Park in Congo. Although climbing the Rwenzori Mountains is the key attraction, the park is also known for the birds, animals and remarkable botany. A combination of heavy rains, cold weather and sunshine has led to the growth of rare vegetation commonly seen in cold countries. Rwenzori Mountains National Park is home to several primates and mammals like Colobus monkeys, buffaloes, chimpanzees, forest elephants and Leopards among others. Over 216 species of birds can be found in the park as well as rare reptile like the three-horned chameleon. Apart from mountain climbing, the park office arranges nature walks and visits to one the local Bakonzo tribe. Read more about the park.



Lake Mburo National Park:

Lake Mburo National Park Lake Mburo is the smallest savannah park in Uganda. The park is located in a strategic area on the main highway leading to Uganda's major game parks like Bwindi, Kibale, Mgahinga and Queen Elizabeth. Tourists coming back from Bwindi and Queen Elizabeth National Parks usually make a stopover for a day before proceeding to Entebbe international airport for departure. Lake Mburo National Park is the only place in Uganda where Zebras can be spotted in great numbers. It is also the best place in Uganda to spot Leopards and Impala because of the high concentration in a small area. Lake Mburo National Park is also the only place where once can go to watch game on back of a horse of by just walking through sections of the park. Being the closest game park to Kampala city, Lake Mburo is perfect for those who have come for a workshop, seminar or business trip in the capital and desire to see some of Uganda's wildlife before coming for a full safari later on. The other attractive activities in Lake Mburo are spot fishing, boat cruises along the lake, birding (among the best) and nature walks.

Mount Elgon National Park:

This national park is a UNESCO Man and Biosphere Reserve found at the borde between Kenya and Uganda. Most of the park is found on the Uganda side of the border. Climbing Mount Elgon (8th highest in Africa) is the main activity in the park but there are several animal species that can be spotted at the foot of the mountain and surrounding areas. The mountain area receives good rains throughout the year and when combined with the fertile soils support the growth of vegetation and forests that provide food for primates, buffaloes and elephants among others.

Nature walks are organized to experience the beautiful scenery, animal and plant life around the park. Visitors who are interested in exploring caves or visiting waterfalls will not be disappointed while visiting Mount Elgon. The famous Sipi Falls are one of the over 50 waterfalls found at the slopes of the mountains. Cultural tours are organized to visit the Bagisu in their coffee farms or to witness their ancient circumcision ceremonies. The other activities arranged within and around the park are bird watching, game viewing, camping, sport fishing, abseiling, cycling or visiting the Matheniko Bokora and Pian Upe Wildlife Reserves



Semuliki National Semuliki:

National Park is found in the district of Bundibugyo along the border between Uganda and the Democratic Republic of Congo. The park has East Africa's only remaining lowland rainforest. The forests in the park are an extension of the great Ituri Forest in the Democratic Republic of Congo creating conditions typically seen in Central Africa. The forest extension has enabled the park to attract bird species not commonly seen in East Africa making the park one of the best places bird watching in Uganda. But it is not only birds and forest that attract tourists to the park. Semuliki National Park is home to two fascinating hot springs - the Sempaya Hot Springs. Visitor can go and take a bath in one of the hot springs or go for a game drive to see some of the animals found in the park. Cultural visits can also be arranged to see the Bakonjo, Batwa or Bamba tribes.

ENTRY

EU citizens planning to enter Uganda must have a passport with a validity of atleast 6 months and a visa. You must apply for the visa on the Internet before starting your journey via the link below:

https://visas.immigration.go.ug and print it out yourself. The cost of the visa is around \$ 50. Other Nationalities may or may not require visas depending on one's country of origin. Please note that each child requires their own child passport as entries using a parent's passport are not valid.

HEALTH CARE

Medical care in Uganda does not meet European standards. The health risk is comparable to that of other African travel destinations. Before starting your journey, you should seek advice from a tropical doctor or your family doctor. A valid vaccination card against yellow fever is required for all travelers from the age of 1. Your family doctor should advise you accordingly. The Federal Foreign Office also recommends checking the standard vaccinations for children and adults in accordance with the current vaccination calendar of the Robert Koch Institute for a trip. For adults, this includes vaccinations against Tetanus, Diphtheria, possibly also, against Polio and Hepatitis A. Hepatitis A and Typhoid are vaccinated against travel, long-term stays or special exposure include hepatitis B, rabies and meningococcal disease (ACWY) recommended.

CLIMATE

Thanks to its high altitude, Uganda has a pleasant, temperate tropical climate which, due to its location on the equator, shows hardly any seasonal temperature fluctuations. The temperatures are therefore, not as high as one maybe used to from other countries and regions in Africa. A day-time temperature of 25-30 °C is rarely exceeded. At night, temperatures can drop to an average of 17 °C. At an altitude of 2,000 m, the temperatures are lower at 10 °C. December to February are the hottest months. The temperatures drop lowest in July and August. But even then, average values of 20 °C are common during the day. There are two dry spells that last from December to February and June to August. However, this does not mean that precipitation is not to be expected, but, the amount of rain experienced is only about half as much as in the other months.

INSURANCE

We strongly recommend that you take out travel health insurance abroad. Please check whether the return transport is included. Hanze tours, Our modular principle gives you the opportunity to put together your own dream trip. And on the desired date and as an individual trip at an affordable price. There also numerous additional tours for individual travelers to choose from on our website. And when do you come to Uganda?

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TRAVEL TIME

The climate in Uganda is relatively balanced, so the travel season is based on the dry seasons the best travel months are therefore June to September and December to January.

The rainiest months are April, followed by May and November. Uganda can also be traveled well during the rainy seasons, because it usually rains only a few hours a day and the sun comes through quickly. However, some national parks and more remote regions can be difficult to reach during the rainy season.

GORILLA TRACKING

Gorilla tracking begins with a hike of several hours through the tropical rainforest. The highlight is the intensive observation of a gorilla group. The minimum age for participation is 15 years. The Gorilla permits are strictly limited and cost an additional 600 US dollars per person. Hanze tours checks the availability of the Gorilla Permits and buys them immediately after your booking.

CURRENCY

The currency in Uganda is the Uganda shilling (UGX). In addition to the local currency, larger hotels also accept US dollars. The most common banknotes are 1000, 2000, 5000, 10,000, 20000 and 50,000 UGX. Foreign currencies can be exchanged in banks or exchange office in the larger cities. Payment options Credit cards are only accepted in Uganda by the larger hotels and some airlines in Kampala. It is best to put together your travel budget in US dollars and euros. Make sure that only US dollar notes are accepted as of the 2006 print date. Travelers' checks can be exchanged in some large banks in Uganda, but are associated with considerable fees

If you choose to do so, the checks should be in US dollars. You can withdraw cash in ATMs in local Currency in Uganda. You can also get US dollars at a few ATMs in Kampala. Withdrawing money with an EC card is only possible in a few banks. The EC card must have the Maestro logo, with the new V- Pay cards it is generally not possible to withdraw money in Uganda. Between 250,000 and 700,000 Uganda shillings per withdrawal are possible depending on the ATM.

TIPS


Given the low monthly salaries, guides, gamekeepers and waiters expect a small tip for your services. In restaurants and bars. 10% of the invoice price is common. For game keepers in the national parks, about USD 5 is appropriate de-pending on the performance. Safari drivers expect an additional income at the end of the safari of approximately USD 20 per day of safari.


Transfer to Murchison Falls National Park through Ziwa rhino sanctuary





We then continue to pass through Ugandan soil along Kagamba, Ntungamo, and Kabale, which is heralded as the Switzerland part of Africa with its hilly scenery and breezes. Finally, we will drive to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park in south- western Uganda where another amazing game drive adventure awaits us. 5 hours from Queen to Bwindi impenetrable National park.

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Day 6:

Gorilla Trekking and Lake Bunyonyi

After breakfast, we will set out for gorilla tracking. The starting point is only 10 minutes away from the accommodation and we will begin with a brief orientation at the Gorilla Briefing Centre. For this activity, each group will have 8 participants with an assigned guide. As a team, you will venture into the forest for a once in a lifetime gorilla tracking experience. In the afternoon, we will depart for Lake Bunyonyi and enjoy the relaxing scenery as we cross the lake. Because this lake is a lowland area, you have the chance to see this beauty from the top of the hills. In the evenlng, a nice ambience awaits you at Entusi re-sort to cap off the day. 2 hours from Bwindi to Lake Bunyonyi.

Day 7:

Lake Bunyonyi

Apart from its serene beauty, Lake Bunyonyi is also known as a place for little birds. In fact, "Bunyonyi" translates to "place of many little birds". Lake Bunyonyi encircles 29 islands of various shapes and sizes. Here, you will embark on a canoe trek to enjoy its serene ambiance and breathtaking views, which has made this place synonymous to paradise. We will also visit the local community in the area and immerse in their culture. You will have the opportunity to volunteer and visit the children of Mwendo where you will be welcomed by tradition- al dances stemming from its rich history. You can also visit the pygmies' community; a member of an ethnic group whose average height is unusually short. An adult man's average height is less than 150 cm tall.



Day 1:

Welcome to Rwanda and Drive to Lake Bunyonyi

Depending on your preference we will pick you up at your accommodation in Kigali or at Kanombe Airport in Rwanda and drive to Lake Bunyonyi. Even while driving the fantastic mountain landscape invites to linger, but there are breathtaking views at our destination, Lake Bunyonyi. Bunyonyi means "place of many little birds" and just the variety of birds offers more photo opportunities than we can use. We take a first photo walk and probably end our search of motifs only in the evening on Kyaghugye Iceland, where we stay over- night.

Day 2:

Drive to Queen Elizabeth National Park and Game Drive in the afternoon

Doday we drive to Queen Elizabeth National Park. The mountain landscape gradually gives way to savanna, bush land, swamps, lakes and rivers. In the afternoon we start for our first game drive. In addition to elephants, buffaloes and the frequently occurring Uganda-Kob, we have the chance to get the rare Serengeti top or Defassa waterbuck in front of our lenses.

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Day 3:

Game Drive and Boat Cruise on Kazinga Channel

We start another game drive early in the morning when the animals are still active. Maybe we still find hippos that have not yet returned into the water from the nightly ramble. But also the chances to see lions, hyenas and leopards are best at this time. Various motives are also offered by the most diverse birds, buffaloes, warthogs, different antelope species and the omnipresent baboons. In the afternoon we change our perspective and take a boat trip on the Kazinga Channel, a natural link between Lake Albert and Lake Edward. It hosts the world's densest population of hippos and many Nile crocodiles. Watching elephants, buffaloes, antelopes, waterbucks and warthogs cooling off from this perspective, has its own special charm, as does watching the multitude of water-based birds.

Day 4:

Chimpanzee Tracking and Lake Bunyonyi

In the morning we drive to Kalinzu Forest Reserve to have an impressive experience, the Chimpanzee Tracking. With Rangers we go to search the habituated chimpanzees. We will probably hear their shouts and drumming on tree trunks before we see the group. We can spend an hour with the animals and try to capture this impressive en-counter in pictures with all our passion. Then we drive to Lake Bunyonyi, where in the evening certainly a lively exchange takes place about today's adventure and the resulting pictures.

Day 5:

Around Lake Bunyonyi

In the morning the area around Lake Bunyonyi is often foggy and offers a very special atmosphere. On this day we can explore the lake with a canoe and visit other islands or scout the settlements on the shores of the lake for photo opportunities.

When visiting the Batwa, which originally inhabited the surrounding forests, we learn more about their original way of life and traditions. We visit them in the mountains, which gives us more beautiful views of the lake and the Virunga mountains in the background.

Day 6:

Gorilla tracking in Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

Today there will be a unique experience. We meet the mountain gorillas in Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. After a short briefing, we enter the mountain forest with rangers to search "our" gorilla family. This may take longer and also may be exhausting. However, this should not stop you from directly encountering these wonderful animals, looking into their faces and experiencing their calm and serenity, but also their power. Again, we have an hour to take as many photos as possible and to collect memories. By the way, on request porters are available. After this wonderful encounter we drive back to Lake Bunyonyi. If our hike in the mountain forest did not take too long, we can visit the orphans of Mwendo, who welcome us dancing and singing

Day 1:

Drive from Kampala /Entebbe to Murchison Falls National Park with stopover at Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary

We pick you up early at your accommodation or at the airport and leave immedi ately. Already during the journey, you can get a good impression of everyday life here, which usually takes place outside during dry weather. About half way we stop at Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary. This is a rhinoceros' sanctuary dedicated to the breeding of these impressive animals. Meanwhile, the 25th cub was born. With a ranger you hike the area in a small group and can approach the animals very quietly an unforgettable experience that also supports the further work there. Then we drive to Murchison Falls National Park, where we finish off the day with a game drive and hopefully many animal sightings. The overnight stay takes place within the park.

Day 2:

Game drive and boat cruise

Immediately after breakfast we start our next game drive. Now temperatures are still low and the animals are active. We have the chance to see lions, hyenas, leopards and jackals. In the afternoon we join a boat cruise, which opens a completely different perspective. We approach the Murchison Falls up stream and besides water residents like hippos and crocodiles we may see many other animals that want to cool down by the heat of the day.

Day 3:

Hike to Murchison Falls and return to Kampala / Entebbe

YIn the morning we make two small walks, which again offer us beautiful views of the waterfalls, but which are usually a bit exhausting due to the unobstructed sunshine.

However, especially the view of the falls from a lookout above is unforgettable. You get an impression of the power and speed with which the water is pushed through the bottleneck. After this last impression we drive back to Kampala / Entebbe.

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FORT PORTAL

This module can be used as a supplement after visiting the Bwindi Impenetrable National Park. You have the opportunity to relax in a beautiful lodge on one of the crater lakes in western Uganda. Hikes, mountain bike tours, boat tours, swimming or playing golf are possible.

Day 1: drive to Fort Portal, overnight stay at Kyaninga Lodge, VP

Day 2 and day 3:

relax, opportunity to go on excursions in the area, visit the market in Fort Portal, play golf, mountain bike tour, hike or swim in Lake or pool. Overnight Kyaninga Lodge, VP.

Day 4: drive to Kampala or Entebbe

MURCHISON

This 4-day safari in the Murchison Falls National Park offers the opportunity to visit the largest park in Uganda. You have the opportunity to see the Big Five, rhinos in the Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary, lions, buffalos, leopards and elephants in the wild. You go on a boat safari on the Nile and see the river plunge 45 meters.

Day 1: drive to Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary, visit the rhinos and continue to Murchison Falls NP, overnight stay at Murchison River Lodge, VP,.

Day 2: game drive in Murchison Falls NP, afternoon boat safari on the Nile, overnight stay at Murchison River Lodge, VP,

Day 3: Boat trip to Lake Albert Nil Delta, visit the stork's beak, afternoon game drive in the park, overnight stay at Murchison River Lodge, VP.




PAIN UPE WILD LIFE SAFARI

Pian Upe Wildlife Reserve offers unforgettable game viewing experiences, birding and cultural entertainment from the nearby Karamojong communities.

Day 1: After an early breakfast, meet our driver/guide at 7:00 am to drive you Eastwards through Mukono, the lush and cool Mabira Forest, Jinja Town (the adventure capital of Uganda), Iganga, Mbale and finally to Pian Upe Wildlife Reserve. Dinner and overnight at a lodge.

Day 2: Today after breakfast, you will go for a guided morning game drive. Look out for the early risers including the hunting cheetahs. Other animals to keep your eyes on are the jackals, roan antelopes, zebras, buffaloes, dik dik, hyenas, baboons, patas monkeys and many others. You will have lunch. relax and later go for a cultural community visit to learn about the ways of the people that live here.

Day 3: return to Kampala with stretching road breaks, you will arrive in the late evening.





Day 1:

Flight from Entebbe to Kisoro in South western Uganda.

Either we meet you early in the morning at the airport in Entebbe or we pick you up from your accommodation in Entebbe. Our flight to Kisoro starts at 7:00 in the morning. During the flight you will have a fantastic view of the beautiful mountain landscapes of South western Uganda. 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Day 2:

Gorilla tracking in Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

In the morning we start early to meet the Rangers. After a brief introduction, the search begins. Depending on the

gorilla family and their morning urge to move this may be more or less exhausting, but on request, porters are available. Once you have found the animals, you have one hour to take photos or just to enjoy the animals' presence and study their behavior.

After this impressive encounter, we drive back to our accommodation, where in the evening there you can relax and reveal today's memories.

Day 3:

Return flight to Entebbe

After a hearty breakfast we drive to the air- field in Kisoro and you are back in Entebbe before mid-day. There is a last bird's-eye view of a dreamlike landscape with which you can combine wonderful memories from now on.

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Day 1:

Arrival Day Entebbe

We will pick you up at the airport in Entebbe (EBB) and bring you to the hotel in Entebbe.

Malakai Eco lodge

Day 2:

Kasese - Ruwenzori National Park 1450 m - Sine Hill 2596 m

From Kasese we drive about 30 minutes to the Ruwenzori National Park entrance. There the usual formalities are clarified before the ascent begins. Through the rainforest it goes steadily uphill. The fascinating mountain world of the 'Moon Mountains' offers a real jungle atmosphere with monkey cries from wild chimpanzees and colobus monkeys. The tall trees are covered with lichen and mush- rooms. Only about 200 meters before the end of the day's stage you will pass the Enock waterfall. The sine hats are below the bamboo Zone, which attracts many different bird species.

Camping

Day 3:

Sine Huts 2596 m - Kiharo Camp 3518m

From the Sine hats you come for the first time on marshy paths, the rubber boots are used. It goes through a unique heather forest, past huge moss cushions and knotty branches. Steep ascents and short descents follow, and swampy paths again and again. The view from the ridge and the magnificent flora compensate for the effort. We hike through the Nyamwamba valley.

Day 4:

Kiharo Camp 3518m - Bugata Camp 4062m

After breakfast you start towards Bugata Camp. The seemingly mystical landscape with deep valleys, small streams, waterfalls on the right and left of the path and the first lakes look like a landscape from another world. The vegetation of Rwenzori is the most original here.

We pass Lake Africa and Lake Kopello and reach Bugata Camp, which is located on a rock above Lake Kopello.



Day 5:

Bugata Camp 4062 m - Butawu Camp 3974 m

It goes steeply up to Bamwanjara Ridge. The path is always over muddy serpentine paths and through several swamps. On a clear day you can see the peaks of Mt. Baker and Mt. Stanley. In the evening we reach Butawu Camp, which is located on the edge of a high valley.

Day 6:

Butawu Camp 3974m - Mutinda Camp 3688m

The first stage of the long descent to Mutinda Camp planned for today leads along the well- known path past Lake Kopello to Lake Africa.

There we leave the well-known path and continue through several swamps, over a deep black trail into an overwhelming landscape of water, sawn grass, moss and lichen. After crossing the river we come to the Mutinda Camp under the Mutinda Rock Shelter.

Day 7:

Mutinda Camp 3688m - Kalalama Camp 3134 m

Today we start after breakfast to a very easy stage. It goes back through mud, swamp, past giant Senezien and Lbelien, over multi-colored Moss cushions and past heather trees. We cross small rivers and enjoy the view of picturesque water landscapes again and again. We reach the Kalalama Camp, it gets noticeably warmer in the evening and there are first signs of a return to Civilization.

Day 8:

Kalalama Camp 3134 m - Kilembe

On the last day of our Ruwenzori trekking tour, we will go through the bamboo zone and through the mountain rain forest again. We leave the national park and come to regions that are used and inhabited for agriculture. There are still a few steep passages before we reach Kilembe in the afternoon.

Day 1:

Arrival Day Entebbe - Mbale

Today we start early from Kampala via Jinja to Mbale, the starting point of our Mount Elgon Tour. During the trip we get a first impression of Uganda. Many dealers are active on the street. You can see the green tea and sugar cane plantations and Lake Victoria. In Jinja you drive over the Owen Falls Dam, which produces almost all of Uganda's electricity needs. Near Mbale you will then see Mount Elgon, a massif protruding from the plain.

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Day 2:

Buma Sola 1710 m - Sasa River Camp 2840 m

In the middle of the village of Buma Sola is the starting point for the Mount Elgon Tour. In addition to fields, bananas and small streams, you climb the steep slope. In front of you is the "Wall of Death" which is easy to climb via 3 metal stairs (no ladders). Take a breather above the wall to enjoy the gigantic view of the plains and the hill chains at the end of the Elgon. As the most difficult stage, there are still more vertical meters ahead of you before you reach the beautifully situated camp.

Sasa River Camp

Day 3:

Sasa River Camp 2840 m - Mude Cave Camp

From the Sasa River Camp the path continues through the rainforest. There are two long climbs to overcome. The roots of the stran- gler figs hang in the Lug, dense vine plants surround winding tree trunks and the leaf roof shines in all shades of green in sunlight. After about 3 hours the view of the mountain formation of Mount Elgon becomes clear. The vegetation changes suddenly. The climb leads the last few kilometers to the camp slightly uphill.

Mude Cave Camp

Day 4:

Mude Cave Camp 3479 m - Wagagayi Peak 4321 m

In the early morning you set off for Wagagayi Peak. The path leads back a few hundred meters on the path of the previous day. Then it goes Steeply up towards Jackson Peak. After approx. 2 hours you will reach the crater rim, on which the ascent continues for a few kilometers. On bright blue days, the view of the surrounding area Plains and the crater particularly impressive.

Mude Cave Camp

Day 5:

Mude Cave Camp 3479m Bumasola 1710 m

From Mude Camp to Bumasola Gate it is a long and gnawing descent. After leaving the Mude Camp, the view of the valley is clear. The well-groomed path leads past a ranger station and at around 3320 meters you dive into the rainforest, past the Sasa River Camp, where the fresh LuG spreads. Shortly before leaving the national park, you descend over 3 steps over the "Wall of Death". After another hour through the village's cultivated zone, you will reach the end of the stage. Around midday you come to the Bumasola Gate and from there drive to Jinja for the night.
